The Department of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery at UT Southwestern Medical Center has established a clinical center dedicated to disorders of the voice and larynx. The center combines the expertise of a multidisciplinary team of laryngologists, otolaryngologists and speech-language pathologists to provide state-of-the-art diagnostic and therapeutic services for conditions such as benign or malignant vocal fold lesions; vocal fold paralysis, bowing or atrophy; spasmodic dysphonia and other neurological conditions.



Our Services Include:

- Videostroboscopy
- Comprehensive evaluation and care of the speaking and singing voice
- Microsurgery of the vocal folds
- Thyroplasty and vocal fold augmentation
- Office-based procedures
- Behavioral intervention

Our Patients Consist Of:

- Singers, teachers, public speakers and others who use their voices heavily
- People who develop voice problems due to neurological disease, trauma and other ailments
- Anyone with an unexplained, persistent voice disturbance
