Williams Co-hosts Inaugural Podcast for Diabetes Journal



Kevin Williams, Ph.D., an Associate Professor in the Center for Hypothalamic Research, co-hosted the premiere episode of <u>DiabetesBio</u>, the American Diabetes Association's monthly podcast for its flagship publication, *Diabetes*. In each episode, Dr. Willimas and his co-hosts interview key authors of editorselected feature articles and highlight research presented in the publication.

Dr. Williams holds a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Texas at Dallas, where he graduated *cum laude*. He earned his doctorate in neuroscience at Tulane University in Louisiana. He then completed a postdoctoral fellowship in

hypothalamic research under **Joel Elmquist**, **D.V.M.**, **Ph.D.**, at UT Southwestern. His research focuses on the underlying physiology of how neural circuits and signaling mechanisms in the brain regulate feeding behavior, energy expenditure, and glucose metabolism. A primary objective is to gain insights into the brain's potential as a therapeutic target for addressing the health challenges associated with obesity and diabetes.

Dr. Williams joined the UT Southwestern faculty in 2009.

TMA President Champions Physician Advocacy



"We have considerable but not unlimited freedom in the work we do," says **Salahuddin "Dino" Kazi, M.D.**, a Professor in the Division of Rheumatic Diseases, Vice Chair of Education, and Internal Medicine Residency Program Director. "Paradoxically this freedom entails an increasing bureaucracy that catalogues, measures, analyzes and ultimately manages this freedom."

In his new book, *The Utopia of Rules: On Technology, Stupidity, and the Secret Joys of Bureaucracy,* David Graeber writes about "the culture of evaluation," saying it's "more pervasive in the hypercredentialized world of the professional

classes, where audit culture reigns, and nothing is real that cannot be quantified, tabulated, or entered into some interface or quarterly report."

Richard J. Baron, M.D., President and CEO of the American Board of Internal Medicine, will present the <u>Internal Medicine</u> <u>Grand Rounds</u> lecture on Friday, Jan. 26, at 8 a.m. in D1.502. His topic: "Protecting the Legitimacy of Medical Expertise: Combating Misinformation in Medicine."

Dr. Baron earned his medical degree from Yale University and holds a degree in English from Harvard College. After completing house staff training at New York University-Bellevue Medical Center he served three years in the National Health Service Corps in Tennessee.

Dr. Baron practiced general internal medicine and geriatrics for almost 30 years at Greenhouse Internists, P.C., located in Philadelphia followed by service as Group Director of Seamless Care Models at the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Innovation Center, where he led efforts related to accountable care organizations and primary care. Dr. Baron also served on the board of the National Quality Forum,

their Health Information Technology Advisory Committee, and the Standards Committee of the National Committee for Quality Assurance, until joining the federal government.
