Pediatric Emergency Medicine Fellowship



Orthopedics/Hand/Sports Medicine/Cast Clinic Rotation

<u>Patient Care</u>: Provide family centered patient care that is developmentally and age appropriate compassionate, and effective for the treatment of health problems and the promotion of health

- 1. Obtain an appropriate orthopedic history reflecting the developmental age of the patient, presenting problem and clinical acuity
- 2. Perform an appropriate joint/extremity/musculoskeletal examination addressing the presenting problem
- 3. Develop a working diagnosis and differential diagnosis and construct a management plan with attending supervision
- 4. Order and interpret appropriate laboratory and radiographic data to determine if surgical intervention is warranted
- 5. Differentiate between emergent and non-emergent conditions

<u>Medical Knowledge:</u> Understand the scope of established and evolving biomedical, clinical, and epidemiological and social-behavior knowledge needed by a pediatrician; demonstrate the ability to acquire, critically interpret and apply this knowledge in patient care.

<u>Practice Based Learning:</u> Demonstrate knowledge, skills and attitudes needed for continuous self-assessment, using scientific methods and evidence to investigate, evaluate, and improve one's patient practice

- 1. Critically appraise and evaluate the literature regarding different approaches to patient management by assimilating current scientific evidence
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of this approach and incorporate this knowledge into the consultation of patients with potential surgical problems
- 3. Actively participate in teaching rounds to improve knowledge and skills
- 4. Incorporate feedback from attending staff, residents and other members of the health care team

<u>Interpersonal and Communication Skills</u>: Demonstrate interpersonal and communications skills that result in information exchange and partnering with patients, their families and professional associates

- 1. Demonstrate an empathic, respectful and effective communication style with patients and families of different cultural and social backgrounds
- 2. Demonstrate sensitivity to limitations in the patient's or family's cognition, emotional state or support
- 3. Interact in a respectful and collegial manner with team members, referring physicians, consulting services and staff
- 4. Promote a professional relationship with patients and families regardless of their socioeconomic and cultural background

<u>Professionalism:</u> Demonstrate a commitment to carrying out professional responsibilities, adherence to ethical principles, and sensitivity to diversity

- 1. Demonstrate compassion, respect and support when providing patient care
- 2. Demonstrate confidentiality and respect privacy when dealing with patients and families
- 3. Demonstrate respect and sensitivity for ethnic, cultural and religious diversity
- 4. Provide support, including language assistance services, to non-English speaking patients and families
- 5. Demonstrate appropriate documentation in medical records
- 6. Avoid use of unapproved abbreviation in the medical record

Systems Based Practice: Understand how to practice high quality health care and advocate for patients within the context of the health care system

- 1. Practice cost-effective health care without compromising quality of care
- 2. Provide assistance to patients and families in dealing with system complexities by advocating participation of a multidisciplinary team when providing patient care
- 3. Know the role and resources provided by members of a multidisciplinary team
- 4. Maintain legible and accurate documentation in the medical record
