## How it all started....





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1. Higher prevalence rate among the unhoused population, with less testing

Of those with controlled HIV - 3% unhoused vs.

Those with uncontrolled HIV - 18% unhoused<sup>1</sup>



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2. Harder to link patients to follow up care after a reactive test

25% of those in the community who recently tested positive remained unlinked to care within 3 months of screening<sup>2</sup>



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3. Increased risk of death due to HIV/AIDS

**27 fold increase** in death from HIV/AIDS if unhoused<sup>3</sup>

#### What can we do at Student Run Free Clinics?



Increase Point of Care testing





Investigate government programs that offer resources




Encourage conversation about high-risk behaviors with our patients

#### **ACCESS Clinic and Government Funding**



#### ACCESS = Adult Comprehensive Care and Engagement Support Services



#### Services Provided:

- HIV primary care
- Mental health services (TIC)
- Medical Nutrition Therapy
- Case Management
- Financial Counseling (onsite)
- HIV Education
- HIV Research
- 24/7 Emergency Services
- In-Patient Medical Care





# HIV Screening Initiative Project Overview

#### **Overview**

#### Preparation –

background research and meetings with the ACCESS Clinic at Parkland Hospital





#### **Student Manager Education –**

developed a curriculum with online training modules, shadowing the clinic including social workers

#### **Logistical Planning –**

proposed a plan to effectively link patients to follow up care at Parkland's HIV Clinic



#### **Testing**

#### **Step 1: Consent**

 Also asking patients to allow access to their Parkland EMR account (important for documentation and future care at our clinic)


#### **Step 2: Provide fingerstick test**

- Important that it is a *rapid* test

#### Step 3: Get results within a couple minutes


- This is *not* a confirmatory test
- Two possible results →








#### Linkage to Care Model



<sup>\*</sup> CDC recommends at least once a year

<sup>\*\*</sup> Prophylaxis therapy reduces the risk of infection by about 99%<sup>7</sup>

#### Linkage to Care Model



#### Challenges



#### So far...

- Legal contracts between UGM and ACCESS at Parkland
- Must have an employee of Parkland Hospital present with the tests

#### **Future Goals - Clinical**

- 1. Supply our own tests working on grants
- 2. Become a site for confirmation lab testing and prophylaxis (PrEP and PEP)
- 3. Introduce HIV screening tests at other Student Run Free Clinics, and maybe even staff "Pop-Up" clinics around Dallas



#### **Future Goals** - Research

#### \*Under IRB Approval\*

1. Survey pt demographics, knowledge about HIV, perceived barriers to HIV screening, and thoughts about our screening clinic

#### **Future Questions**

- 1. Prevalence of HIV in Dallas unhoused community
- 2. Linkage to care longitudinal study
