

## Hematopathology Rotation - Objectives

### Practice-Based Learning and Improvement

- A. **Objectives:** Appreciate the application of literature review, journal club, and interdepartmental conferences.
- B. **Plan:** Residents are expected to present interesting cases at the CP rounds on a rotating basis, in addition, the senior resident might be asked to present case(s) at the Thursday Hematopathology Review conferences. Residents will discuss the case with the rotation director prior to the presentation. During the work-up of difficult cases, residents will be asked to perform a literature search on a topic in order to provide new scientific information in the field. Residents will attend the joint conferences with the hematology/oncology division and other services, in which the pathology results are included in the decision making process regarding the overall management of the patient. Senior residents are expected to photograph and present at least one case at these sessions each month. These conferences also allow one to keep abreast of progress in patient management and basic and translational research that may impact on the pathology practice. The residents are expected to attend the monthly hematopathology journal club in order to participate in a literature-based discussion of cutting edge information relevant to the practice of hematopathology.
- C. **Assessment:** Direct observation by Hematopathology faculty and fellows.
