

Pediatric Pathology Rotation - Objectives

Medical Knowledge

A. Objectives

1. The resident is expected to become familiar with the gross and microscopic appearance of common conditions and diseases presenting in various areas of pediatric surgical pathology.

B. Plan

1. The knowledge is attained through faculty teaching, review of the literature including texts and journal articles, and attendance at departmental conferences. The conferences include, but are not limited to
 - Hematology/oncology tumor board – weekly
 - Surgical pathology quality assurance conference – weekly
 - Surgical pathology combined conference – bi-weekly
 - GI conference – monthly
 - Departmental research conference - monthly
2. The resident is expected to present his/her cases at the surgical pathology combined conference.

C. Supervision/Assessment

1. The faculty directly observes the resident during the rotation and completes an evaluation at the end of the rotation, which is conveyed to the resident by the director of service in verbal and written form. The resident is evaluated at the time of conference presentations by the faculty member assigned to the conference, and direct feedback is given as appropriate.
