

## **Pediatric Pathology Rotation - Objectives**

### **Practice-Based Learning and Improvement**

#### **A. Objectives**

1. Preparation of a complete and informative surgical pathology report, including use of consultants and the medical literature.

#### **B. Plan**

1. The resident is responsible for using the medical literature to read about difficult or instructive cases. Faculty also provide assistance in analysis of the existing literature through the sharing of information regarding specific cases. Difficult cases may require consultation, and the resident is responsible for seeking consultation and documenting this in the report.
2. The resident is responsible for providing succinct and informative presentations at the surgical pathology combined conferences. In addition, the faculty provide the resident with opportunities on a daily basis to share information or analysis of cases.

#### **C. Supervision/Assessment**

1. The faculty directly observes the resident during the rotation and completes an evaluation at the end of the rotation, which is conveyed to the resident by the director of service in verbal and written form. The resident is evaluated at the time of conference presentations by the faculty member assigned to the conference, and direct feedback is given as appropriate.
