

Pediatric Pathology Rotation - Objectives

Professionalism

A. Objectives

1. Understanding that the pathologist must provide cogent diagnoses using good communication skills, sometimes in the setting of pressure for rapid diagnoses.
2. Serving as a member of the team, which includes faculty, technologists, and transcriptionists

B. Plan

1. Daily interactions with clinicians, transcriptionists, histotechnologists, and pathologists through observation and responses to questions and demands.

C. Supervision/Assessment

1. The faculty directly observes the resident during the rotation and completes an evaluation at the end of the rotation, which is conveyed to the resident by the director of service in verbal and written form. The resident is evaluated at the time of conference presentations by the faculty member assigned to the conference, and direct feedback is given as appropriate.
