Division faculty are also developing novel community engagement (CE) and translational research strategies related to the Department of Clinical Science's Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA).

Qualifications include a doctoral degree in the social sciences, public health, epidemiology, medicine, behavior science, community health, or other relevant field; a research focus on minority and underserved populations; and a record of extramurally funded community-based or behavioral research and publications. Experience and interest in community-based participatory research (CBPR) and community action research is desirable. Selection will be based on the candidate's strength of interest and experience in participatory approaches to health disparities research, and a demonstrated commitment to multidisciplinary research. Candidates at the Assistant Professor level must have a record or strong promise of scholarly achievement and extramural funding.
