Plan to spend a truly special summer afternoon and evening honoring [five staff members and one team](#) whose contributions strengthen our mission every day.

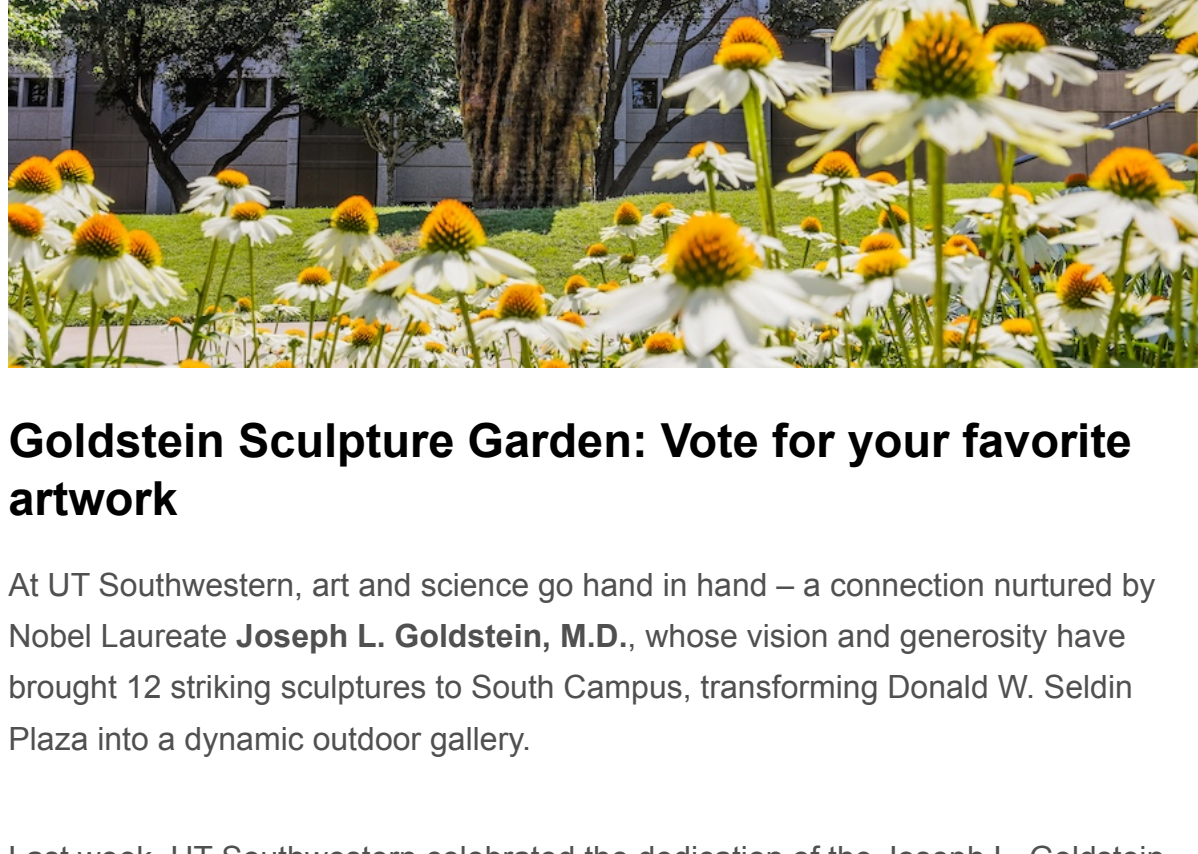

Goldstein Sculpture Garden: Vote for your favorite artwork

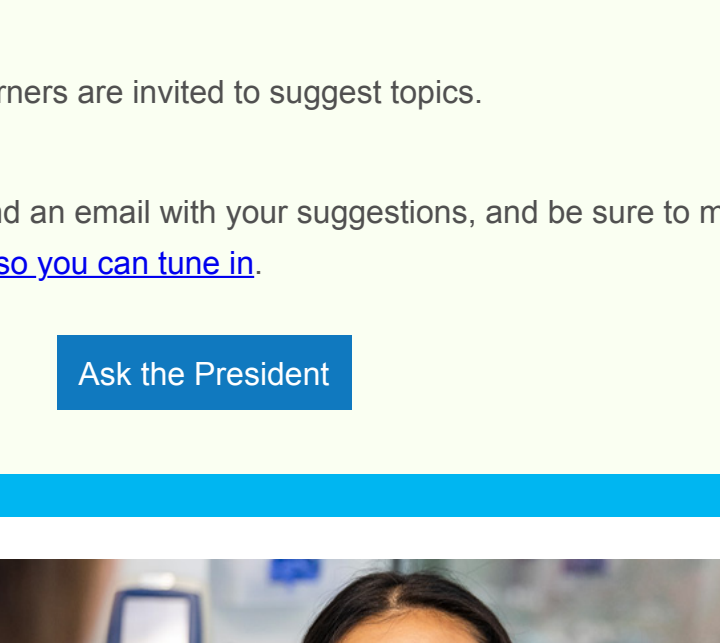
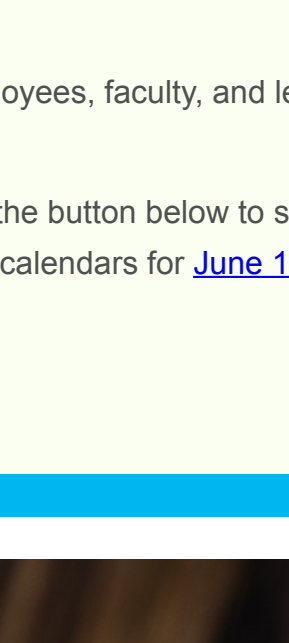

Ask the President: Send your questions for the next campus briefing

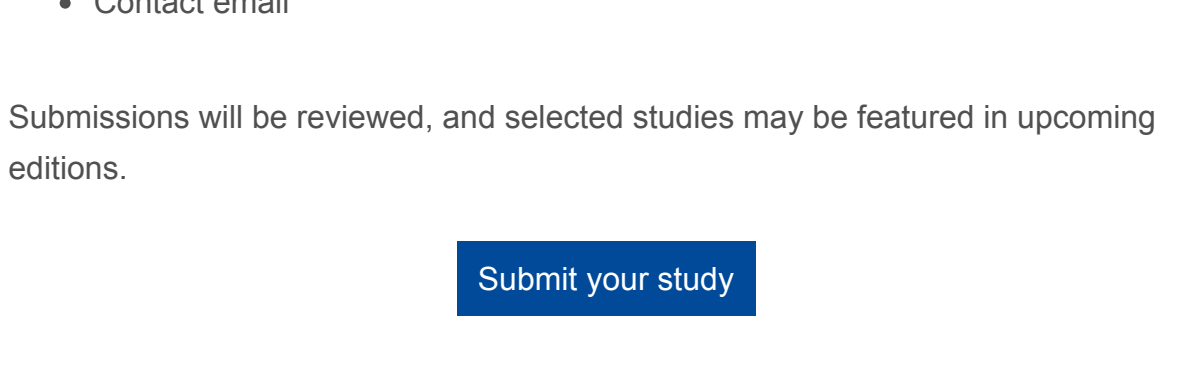
Now is a great opportunity to share what's on your mind.

Need participants for your clinical trial?

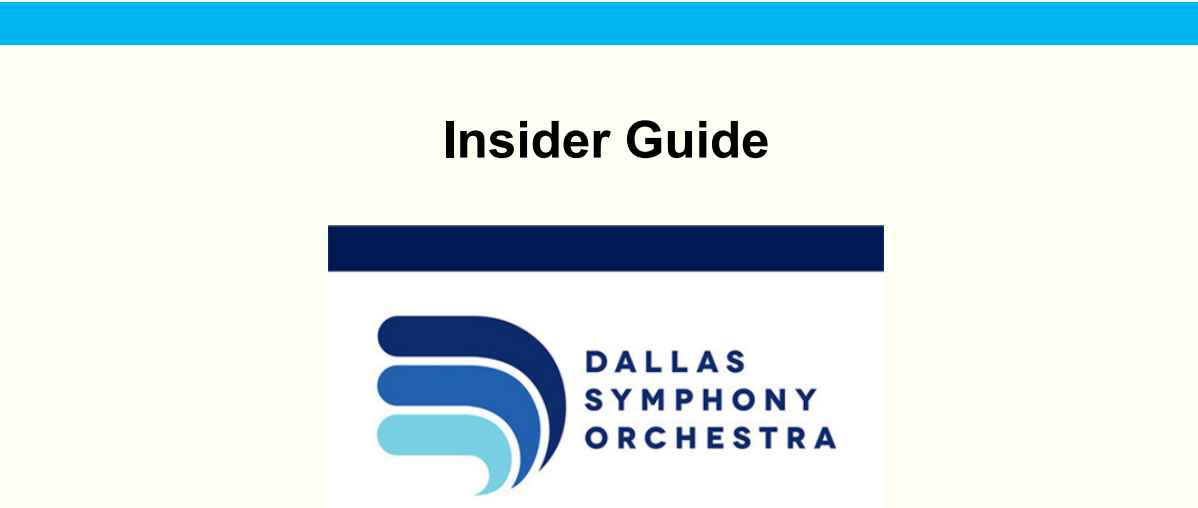

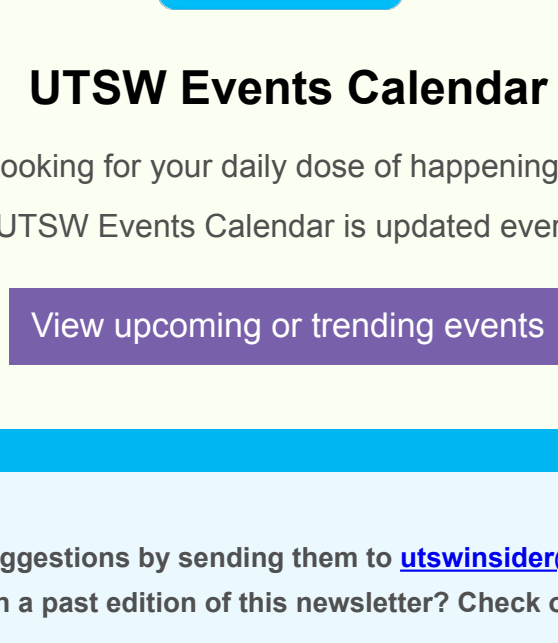
Each fair will feature resources and tools on such topics as home, vehicle, workforce, psychological, personal, food, campus, and travel safety.
