THE MARGARET MILAM McDERMOTT CHAIR OF ANESTHESIOLOGY SEAL



In April 1966, the Board of Regents of the University of Texas announced the endowment of a Chair of Anesthesiology at Southwestern Medical School by Mr. & Mrs. Eugene McDermott, naming the Chair in honor of Mrs. McDermott. The departmental seal was designed by M.T. Jenkins (circa 1966) to commemorate the establishment of the Margaret Milam McDermott Chair of Anesthesiology.

In the form of the eternal circle, the seal has the initials of UTSMS Dallas at the top. The key in the center symbolizes the key role that anesthesiology plays in the relief of surgical pain. The kidney shape in the hand grip of the key symbolizes the department's dedication to fluid balance in the surgical patient. The locking device of the key is shaped like a shamrock symbolizing the Irish heritage of the McDermott Family. The lone star is the symbol of the state of Texas. On the left is the oriental poppy, the plant symbolizing of opium, the source pharmacologic relief of pain. On the right is the chondrodendron tomentosum, the plant source of curare, symbolizing surgical relaxation. The circle binds the alumni of the program into eternal union with the institution which trained them.


















Lessons Learned Along My Journey. . .
