Education

Civic Engagement: helped 400+ residents and community members register to vote, providing important election information and education

Bike Helmet Give-Away: partnered with Texas Medical Association and BikeDFW to give away 100 free helmets while promoting e-scooter and bicycle safety in Deep Ellum

Texas Medical Association: actively involved in committees to serve trainees/patients
