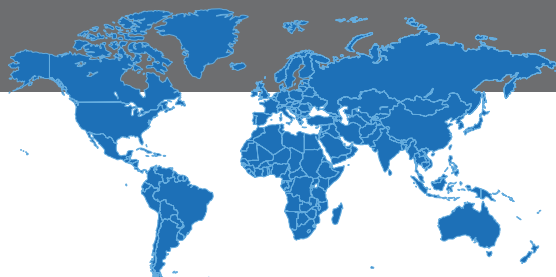
About the Program

The UTSW Simmons Cancer Center is looking for early career scientists from all around the world to take part in the International Postdoctoral Scholars in Cancer Research Fellowship.

This is a 2-year program that provides scientists with the opportunity to train in the research laboratories at one of the country's leading academic medical centers.

With the help of the Mary Kay Ash Charitable Foundation; the goal of this program is to contribute to the training of cancer researchers and foster collaboration with top research institutes around the world.

At the time of completion, trainees will be eligible for a grant to support the establishment of their research in their home country.



Selection & Eligibility

Stipend level will be equal to the NIH scale with additional funds for travel and research supplies. Fellows will be chosen based on scientific excellence. Particularly interested in applicants focused on: lung, colon, breast, uterine, ovarian and cervical cancer. Additional requirements:

1. English proficiency
2. Applicants must be a recent MD with laboratory experience, PhD or MD/PhD within the first year of post graduate training to be eligible.

2. Two letters of recommendation
3. Brief abstract of PhD or current project (1 page)
