- 1. Classify current HIV screening guidelines, and review how to diagnosis HIV and counsel patients on their new diagnosis.
  - 2. Name at least two factors to consider when deciding to start antiretroviral therapy.
    - 3. Apply current vaccination recommendations to persons living with HIV.
  - 4. Define up-to-date cervical and anal pap testing recommendations for persons living with HIV.
    - 5. Review HIV and pregnancy.
  - 6. Emphasize the more common co-morbid conditions people living with HIV are at risk for developing.7. Identify resources to assist with HIV management.
