# Q6. When are end dates extended on a grant project?

The following is a list of award types and the conditions under which extensions are granted:

### Federal

- End dates *can only be extended* if there is authorized documentation by the sponsor, such as a No Cost Extension or an Amended Notice of Award.
- End dates *cannot be extended* to allow expenses to hit outside of the period of performance.

## State

- End dates *can only be extended* if there is authorized documentation by the sponsor, such as a No Cost Extension or an Amended Notice of Award/Contract.
- End dates *cannot be extended* to allow expenses to hit outside of the period of performance.

### Private

- End dates *can only be extended* if there is authorized documentation by the sponsor, such as a No Cost Extension or an Amended Notice of Award/Contract.
  - If the private contract is a clinical trial with an undefined period of performance, the dates will allow a four-year period of performance. As that end date approaches, confirmation is needed from the Sponsor stating the study is still open. If documentation is not provided, the Chart of Accounts (COA) will be closed, and the residual balance will be transferred to the departmental Chair account.
- End dates *cannot be extended* to allow expenses to hit outside of the period of performance.
  - If documentation is not provided from Sponsor for Fixed Billing projects confirming that the study is still open, the COA will be closed and the residual balance transferred to the departmental Chair.

## Industry

• The award end dates for industry contracts are set to the year 2040. Project end dates *can be requested to extend* if necessary.
