

Post-Doctoral Researcher position in genomic disorder research

A postdoctoral position is available in the laboratory of Dr. Kosuke Izumi, in the Division of Genetics and Metabolism, Department of Pediatrics at UT Southwestern Medical Center, to study genomic disorders, particularly Pallister-Killian syndrome. Our <u>laboratory</u> has several exciting projects related to Pallister-Killian syndrome, which is a rare genomic disorder due to isochromosome 12p. Taking advantage of unique features of Pallister-Killian syndrome, we aim to learn the molecular mechanism of genomic disorders/chromosomal disorders in general. In addition to the mechanistic investigations of Pallister-Killian syndrome, our laboratory is actively involved in the discoveries of novel genetic/genomic disorders associated with various pediatrics diseases.

Candidates must hold a Ph.D. and/or M.D. degree. Experience in basic molecular biology experiments leading to publication in peer-reviewed journals is recommended.
