A national search will be launched next week for the inaugural Dean of the <u>Peter O'Donnell Jr. School</u> <u>of Public Health</u>. Gregory Fitz, M.D., Professor, Department of Internal Medicine, and former Provost and Dean will serve as chair of the search committee. Other members are:

The committee will work with the search consultant firm Isaacson, Miller to recruit a leader who will set the strategy to meet the school's goals of translating scientific discoveries into public health solutions and expanding the public health workforce in Texas, needs underscored by the COVID-19 pandemic.

As President Podolsky announced, a \$100 million gift from the O'Donnell Foundation makes UT Southwestern the recipient of the largest gift to a School of Public Health at a public university in the U.S. The Peter O'Donnell Jr. School of Public Health will welcome its first class for the Master of Public Health degree in the fall of 2023 and launch its doctoral degree programs in 2024.

Generous supporters of the Peter O'Donnell Jr. School of Public Health also include Miss Lyda Hill, who has endowed a deanship, and Dr. Richard Hoffman, whose endowed fund will support scholarships for incoming students.

We expect UT Southwestern's unique academic and research opportunities, our region's large and diverse population – and the generous donor support – will serve our national search by attracting candidates committed to providing the highest level of science-based guidance to optimize the health and well-being of all communities.
